



### Educational Tour at Nabadwip : the birth place of Mahaprabhu Chaitanya Deva:



### 30 hours Add on course on “Bengali Language and Literature: Possibility and Utility”

The Bengali Department successfully held a 30-hour add-on course on '**Bengali Language and Literature: Possibility and Utility**' from **November 5 to November 13, 2024**. The course saw participation from 100 Bengali Honours students.

Students were trained in practical skills such as content writing, journalism, proofreading, report writing, news writing, and anchoring, which are crucial for careers in publishing. In addition to college professors, invited speakers included Goutam Banerjee, Senior Editor of Ananda Bazar Patrika, who spoke on the printing media, and Subhankar Dey, owner of Dey's Publishing House, who discussed career opportunities for Bengali literature students in publishing. An exam was held at the end of the course, and all participants were given certificates.



### Classes provided to students through ICT

The Department of Bengali employs various teaching methodologies to make subjects more appealing and relevant to students. The goal is to make the content both engaging and up-to-date.

For instance, they use methods like **seminar presentations** and **wall magazines**. The department also utilizes new teaching tools. For the theoretical subjects of Bengali language and literature, such as linguistics, meter (Chhanda), and rhetoric (Alankar), they use the **ITC Method** (Information Technology and Communication) to teach these topics.
